- What is the first step toward bringing about this change?



The resurrection is not a fairy tale or myth; rather it is a fact of history (1 Cor 15:3-4). Yet, Christ is more than a mere fact—He is a living Person who meets with us via His Word and Spirit. He deserves our worship—i.e. not *just* the bowing of our knees in submission, but the trust of our hearts and obedience of our lives.

S. Lewis Johnson: “[The resurrection] is God’s ‘Amen’ to Christ’s ‘It is finished.’”

Leon Morris: “The same power that brought Christ back from the dead is operative within those who are Christ’s. The resurrection is an ongoing thing.”

James Stewart: “This [the resurrection] is no appendix to the faith. This **is** the faith. He is risen! The Lord is risen indeed!” (emphasis mine)

John Stott: “Christianity is in its very essence a resurrection religion. The concept of resurrection lies at its heart. If you remove it, Christianity is destroyed.”
