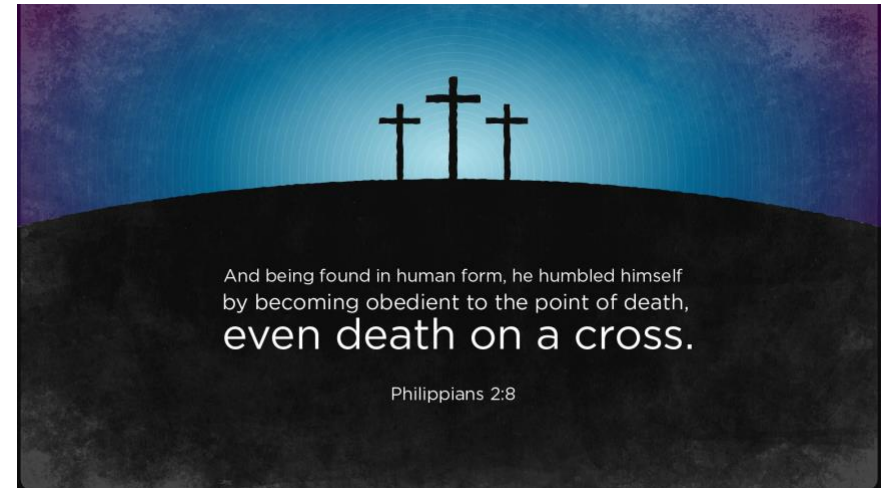
- How does God want my beliefs and/or actions to change?
