

Application Questions

...be doers of the word, and not hearers only... (James 1:22, ESV)

Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Philippians 2:12-13; 1 Timothy 4:7-9; James 1:22-27).

As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions:

- How does God want my beliefs and/or actions to change?
- How can I accomplish this change?
- What is the first step toward bringing about this change?

1. Retrace the steps of Christ's humiliation (vv. 6-8). What does it mean for you to share this "mind of Christ"?
2. Christ "did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped" (v. 6). The phrase in Greek means to guard one's rights...Christ did not jealously guard His rights as deity. In a sense, however, Paul guarded his rights as a Roman citizen in Philippi (the very city to which he is writing) in Acts 16. Was he behaving in a self-centered fashion at that point? What should the attitude of a Christian be to his or her "rights" and to "civil rights"?

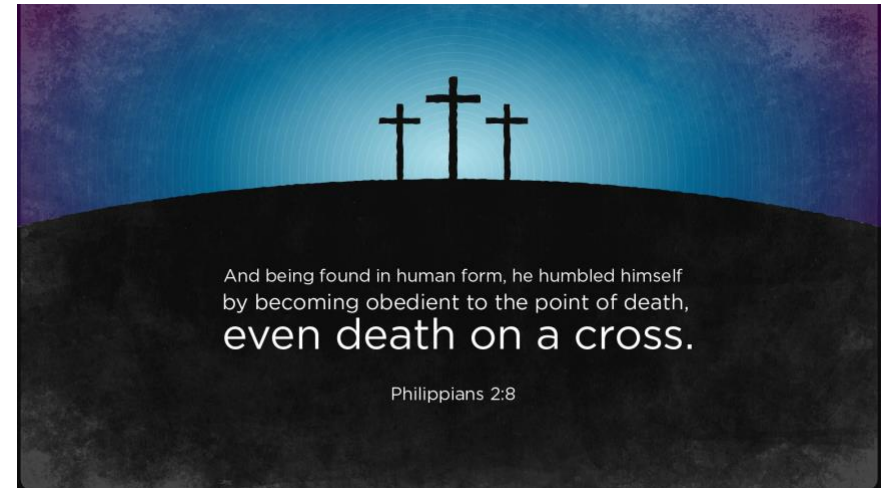
