Application Questions

... be doers of the word, and not hearers only... (James 1:22, ESV)

Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Philippians 2:12-13; 1 Timothy 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions:

- How does God want my beliefs and/or actions to change?
- How can I accomplish this change?
- What is the first step toward bringing about this change?

- How has God's presence been a comfort to you in these days of pandemic?
- Think on God's omnipotence as well as His omnipresence. What counsel can you give to others who are perhaps gripped by fear concerning God's power both to save and encourage them?
